look like to you**

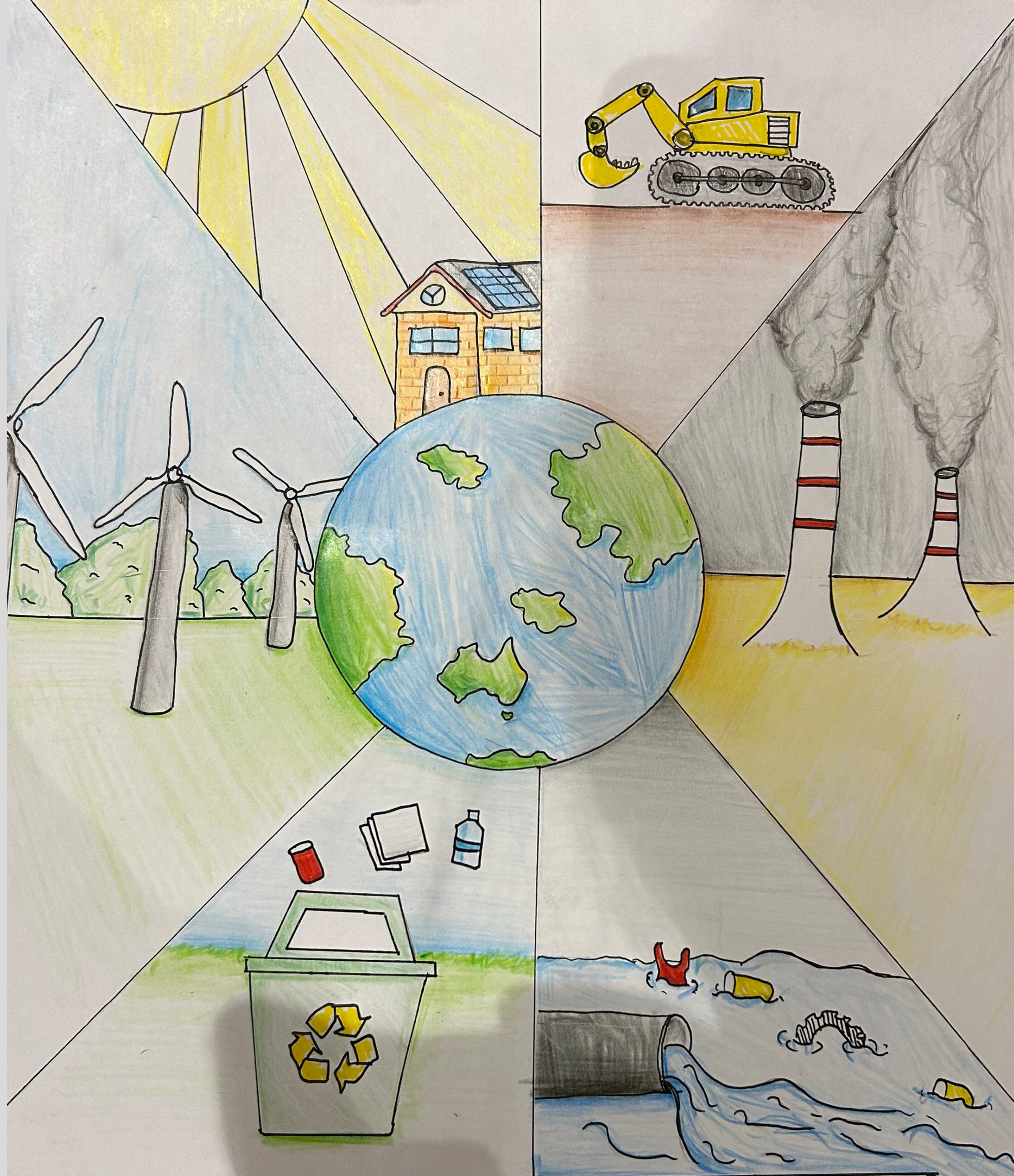


What does peace with creation look like to you

In the middle, I drew wind turbines that generate renewable energy on the left, and on the right side, I drew gases that pollute the earth coming out of a power station. I also drew a house with solar panels on it, and on the right, digging up the Earth. It connects to our school theme “Hope” because it cultivates a belief in positive outcomes and the ability to achieve goals.



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
