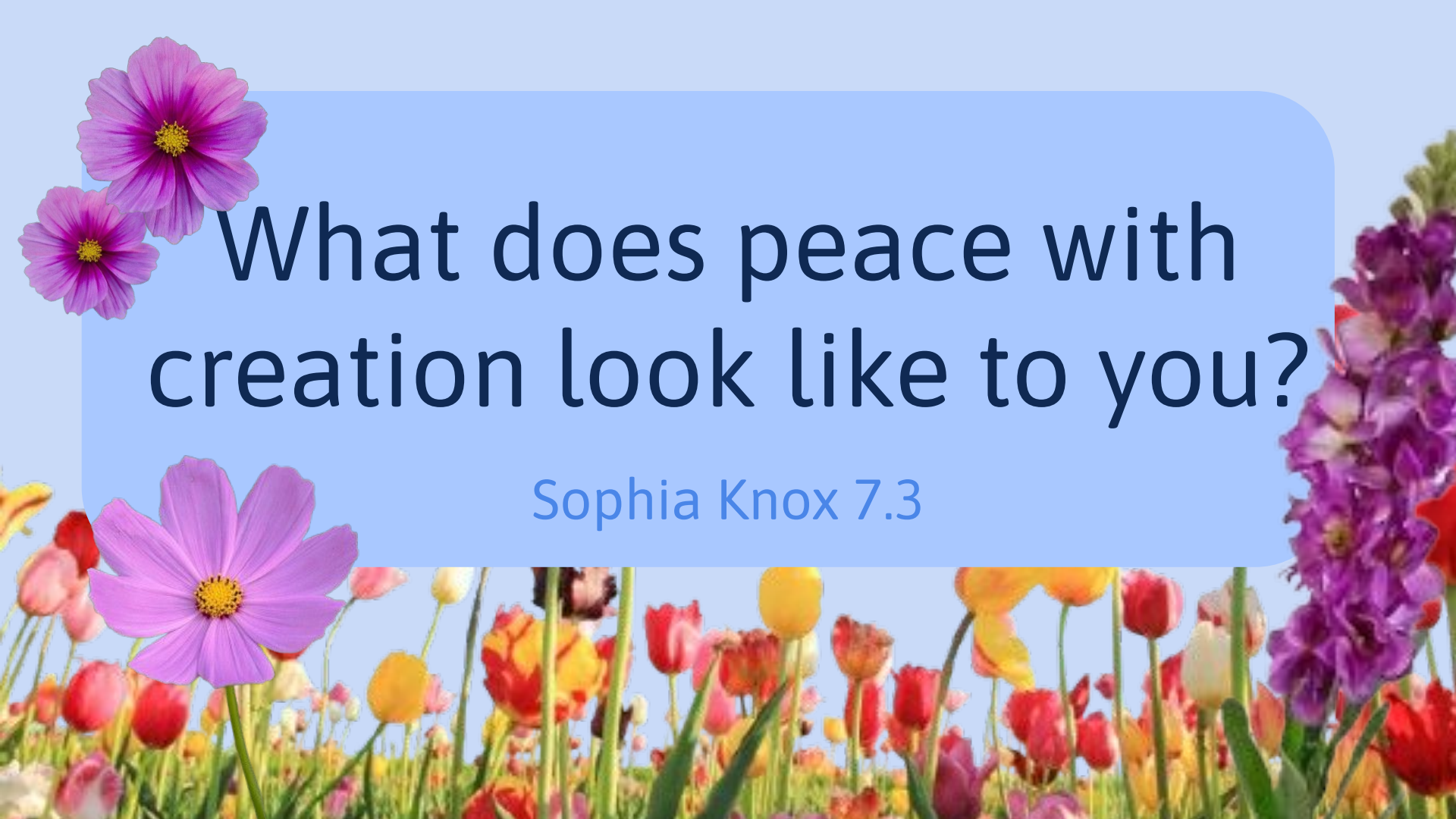




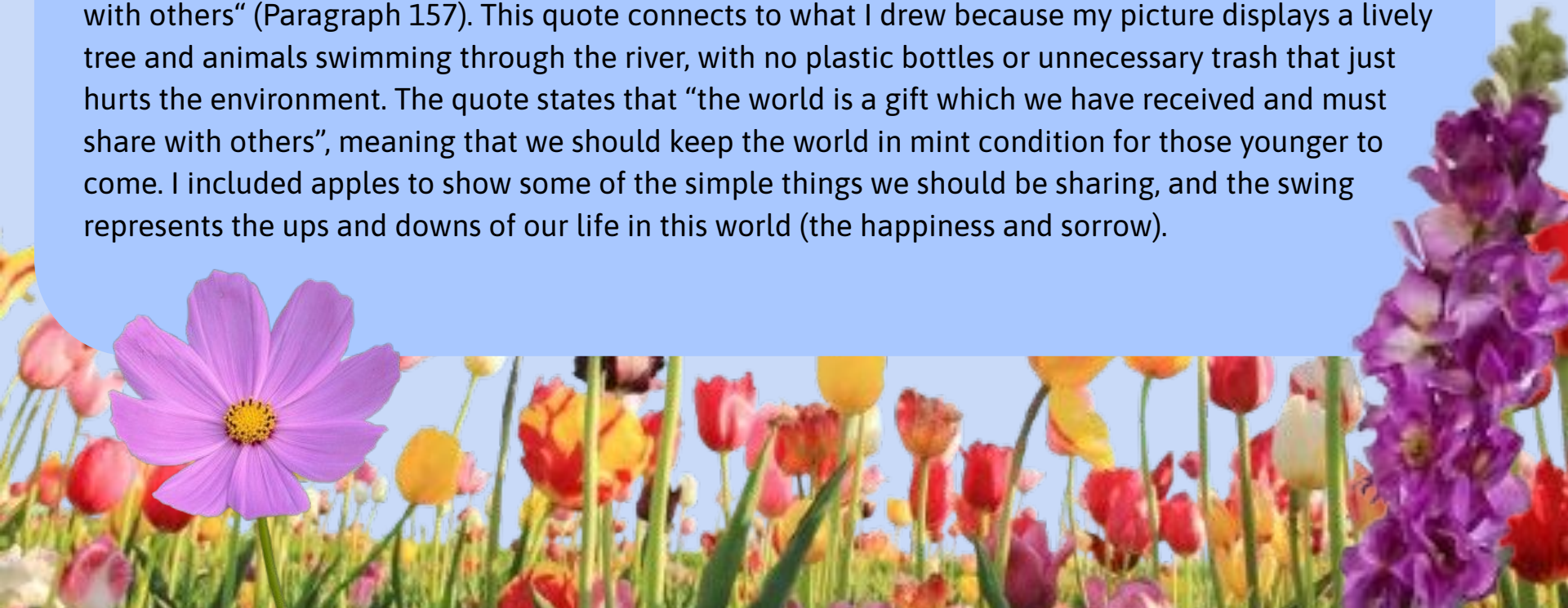
What does peace with
